## Holy Week and Easter 2017

Dear Member and Friend of the St. John the Baptist Community,

An ad on TV last night got me reflecting. It was by one of the companies that for a price will check your DNA. A swab of your saliva sent off for analysis and in a couple of weeks you will know if your ancestry really is German and not Irish, Slovenian rather than Greek. What is your identity? To whom are you related? For \$99 now you can know. I decided to save my money. For who I am, and who you are, and to whom we're related, is already known.

Our essential identity and ancestry were given to us by God in that moment, for most of us so many years ago, when at the font of Baptism, by water and the Spirit, God, King of the universe, said this about each of us: "I have called you by name, you are mine!" (Isaiah 43:1), children of the heavenly Father. That is who we are! Wow! God is our Papa! Now, that's an ancestry!

But, there's more! God decided to come to this earth in human form, born of Mary, to show humankind God's heart of perfect love. Truly, in Jesus "the greatest story ever told" was lived out for us and our salvation! Don't forget **Bible Study** each Tuesday evening, **7 PM**, as we explore the appointed Scripture readings for the upcoming Sunday.
