At present, volunteers with the Asylum Seekers Project in Delaware are supporting St. John's Episcopal Church in McAllen, Texas.

The church is located near the Brownsville, Texas and the Matamoros, Mexico border where thousands of men, women and children are living in a tent city or under the bridge linking the United States and Mexico awaiting entry into the United States.

Weekly, parishioners prepare food and load other humanitarian assistance items (medicine, tents, sleeping bags, blankets, backpacks) into garden carts and walk across the bridge into Mexico.
