Dear Members and Friends of St. John the Baptist,

Praying you are enjoying time for relaxation, rest and renewal during these slower days of summer. For our parish, however, these days are anything but quiet or slow. At the very time that many of us are away on vacation, ministries at St. John the Baptist are increasing, in need of support, in need of you! Let me hold up some of them for your participation.

This coming Wednesday, July 18, and continuing the five Wednesdays following, ending August 15, we are inviting every child you can think of, ages 4-12, for "Wednesdays with God's Buddies," our version of Vacation Bible School. This year's exciting theme is "Rolling River Rampage," inviting children on a white-water rafting adventure to experience the ride of a lifetime with God! Through relevant music, exciting science, creative crafts, fun recreation, and memorable Bible stories, kids will learn that God is with them through anything. The adventure begins each Wednesday at 5:30 p.m., with dinner, and concludes at 7:30 p.m. Deacon Paula is participating!
