Dear Member or Friend of St. John's:

"Look at the fig tree and all the trees. When they sprout leaves, you can see for yourselves and know that summer is near."( Luke 21-29-30) In these verses, Jesus is talking about looking for signs of the seasons. As I see school buses on the roads, chrysanthemums and pumpkins at local nurseries, a letup from sweltering heat, a little less traffic on the Coastal Highway, shortening days, I'm reading the signs of the seasons and know summer is drawing to a close. Where has it flown to?! I pray yours provided time for R and R, a slower pace, and quality time for fun with family and friends.

Now, though, with the coming of fall, the return of activities at St. John's, and the start of new ones, is fast approaching. The next **Weeding Party** will be on Tuesday, September 13, 9 AM. I make fun about it being a "party," but we really do have fun together and, at the same time, keep St. John's grounds pristine! In connection with our landscape, there

will be a **Work Day** on Saturday, October 15, again at 9 AM. We will clean the grounds, prepare with compost the beds on either side of the front entrance for landscaping in the spring, and plant a host of bulbs for spectacular beauty next spring!

St. John's **Book Club** resumes on Monday, September 19, 7 PM. Participants will review Rebecca Kanner's "Esther: A Novel," which examines the biblical Queen Esther and her courage to stand up for what is right, no matter the risk. This book is available in Kindle, paperback, or hardcover.

A memorable, historical, fun **Trip is planned for Wednesday, September 14**, to Delaware's capital, Dover, to tour the Governor's home and guest house followed by a bag lunch (bring one with you, beverage and dessert provided) enjoyed in the gardens and on the porches of the Governor's home, and then a tour of the Victrola Museum, followed by a walking tour of The Green led by a guide in 18th century dress. **The Right Reverend Wayne Wright, Episcopal Bishop of Delaware**, will make his yearly, and farewell, visit to us on Sunday, October 30, preaching at the Mass and receiving new members. With his retirement in early 2017, we commend Bishop Wright for his faithful shepherding of the churches and priests of the Diocese over a span of decades. Lunch will be served in the Parish Hall that day. In preparation for the Bishop's visit, I will be leading three sessions of an **Inquirer's Class** for those wishing to become members of St. John's by Confirmation, or simply to explore Episcopal faith and practice. Hope you're as happy and thankful as I am to see the beautiful new roof on our Sanctuary and Parish Hall! The re-siding of the outside walls of the Parish Hall will begin any day now.
