Dear Members and Friends of the St. John the Baptist Family,

As I write you, New Year's is only a few days away. "What?!" you might ask, "It's not even Christmas yet!" As you probably know, I refer to this coming Sunday, the First Sunday in Advent, which is the church's New Year's Day, beginning another year of grace! We associate New Year's Day with making noble resolutions for self-improvement. So maybe this First Sunday in Advent might be the ideal time to decide, if you've been away from us, that it's a great time to return to worship with your St. John's family—getting back to the habit of regularly nourishing your soul with the grace made manifest in God's Word proclaimed and the Supper received, and for sure, the encouragement and support that comes from being part of a faith community among sisters and brothers in Christ.

As the days keep growing shorter, we rejoice that he has made us people of the day, who look to him as the Everlasting Light, the Light no darkness can overcome!

The four Sundays of Advent will lead us to the celebration, with great solemnity and exultation, of the Birth of the unquenchable Light, the Savior, on Christmas Eve night:
